MAIA

WELCOME TO MAIA!

Maia is a Portuguese city in the District of Porto, North region and sub-region of Greater Porto, with around 35,625 inhabitants.

It is the seat of a city with an area of 83.14 km² and 140,859 inhabitants (2008), subdivided into 17 parishes. The municipality of Maia is limited to the north by the municipalities of Trofa and Santo Tirso, to the east by Valongo, to the southeast by Gondomar, to the south by the city of Porto, to the southwest by Matosinhos and to the northwest by Vila do Conde.

History

The area where the city is currently located has been populated for millennia, and remains have been found dating back to the Paleolithic. In many of the mountains in the region there were settlements from the Iron Age. Attracted by the rich soil and abundance of resources, the Romans also left visible marks of their occupation here.

In the middle of the 13th century, the maiato court extended from the city of Porto to Ave river and from the sea to the mountains. In 1304, however, the lands of Maia were integrated into the Porto terminus, losing administrative and political autonomy. In 1360, the first grantees were established in the region and, in that year, D. Pedro I donated the lordship of Azurara, with the judgment of Maia, to Infante D. Dinis, his son.

The history of this municipality is also closely linked to the founding of nationality. Some authors even argue that Prince Afonso Henriques (that became the first King of Portugal) was educated here, alongside the Mendes da Maia family, to which belonged the Archbishop of Braga D. Paio Mendes and the famous warrior Gonçalo Mendes da Maia, the "Lidador", so called by having entered into constant fearless fights against the Saracens.

At the beginning of the 16th century, it was up to D. Manuel I to grant the charter, which provided for the rents and fees to be paid to the donees of the reguengos of Maia, as well as the way to exercise the most common penalties and justice. Between the years 1700 and 1836, the municipality was made up of 44 parishes and encompassed the entire maritime strip between Leça and Ave rivers. With the administrative reforms that began in 1836, it became an autonomous municipality, but reduced in area and number of parishes. In 1857, it even became extinct and it was on 1868 it was restored.

After the proclamation of the Republic in 1910, Maia (elevated to town in 1902) had, for some time, the philosopher tribune Leonardo Coimbra as administrator.

On August 23, 1986, Maia was finally elevated to the category of city.



ADDRESS

The well-known Maia tournament is now in its 20th edition. It was on April 25th of the year 2000 that the Maia Karate Club decided to hold its first event at the Pavilhão Municipal do Corim, thus part of the April 25th celebrations (Portugal Liberty Day).

From year to year, the event has grown, and in 2010 it presented record numbers with participation of over 1200 competitors and more than 100 teams, thus becoming the most participatory event ever in Portugal. International participation is a certainty and for this reason the name of the event was changed from 'Tournament 25th of April' to 'Maia International Karate Open'.

This year's edition will take place at the Gueifães Municipal Arena, with a capacity of 1000 people, satisfying the needs of our athletes and the public present.



ACCREDITATION

All Coaches must collect their credentials at the Arena in a specific area.

1st December (friday): from 18h to 22h

2nd December (saturday): from 8h to 10h and from 14h to 15h

3rd December (sunday): from 8h to 9h

WEIGHT-IN

Weigh-in will be carried out in the warm-up area, in a separate room.

1st December (friday): from 19h to 21h.

2nd December (saturday): from 10h to 11h and from 13h to 15h.

3rd December (sunday): from 9h to 11h30.



For a good event preparation, please check the weights of the registered athletes, before the publication of the final draws to avoid changes, which causes damages to all parts.

Please note:

- Each athlete must weight-in at least **one hour before** its competition.
- From the publication of the final draws (2023/11/27), if the athlete is out of weight for which he / she was enrolled, he / she may registrate in the correct category, paying a penalty of 20€.

WARM-UP

There will be two preparation areas for the competitions:

Warm-up: floor -1.

Warm-up pre-competition: floor 0, with a specific warm-up area for each tatami.

ATTENTION: Athletes must be in the warm-up area **one hour before** their competition. Any athlete who does not appear in the warm-up area at the time of the call will be automatically excluded.

MEALS

For all those interested, the organization will provide lunches, in the arena bar or in the Gueifães school canteen which is located next to the arena.

REFEREES

All Referees must discuss their participation in the event with the organization, so that they can make lunches reservations, book accommodation if necessary and possible participation in cost allowances.

PRIZES

Medals 1st, 2nd e 3rd places.

Participation medals for U10 and U12.

U14, U16, U18: Prize Money in sports equipments.

+18: Prize Money in metallic value.

The Maia International Karate Open will be broadcast live to the karate community.



AIRPORT


Francisco Sá Carneiro International Airport (Oporto) is 10 km far from the Arena of Gueifães, taking just 15 minutes by car or taxi.



RULES

The Maia International Open will take place under the rules of the Portuguese National Karate Federation (FNKP) and World Karate Federation (WKF), with the exception of the notes referenced below.

KATA

The kata rules will be those of the FNK-P/WKF.

Infantile (U10): Must perform at least two katas alternately from the list below and in the final they will be able to perform a free kata.

- Gekisai
- Fukyukata
- Taikyoku
- Heian
- Pinan

Please Note: Simple and direct qualifiers with repechages for third-placed athletes and 2nd league for fifth-placed athletes. In the final, they can perform free kata.

Initiate (U12): Must perform a basic kata in the first round; In the remaining rounds they will be able to perform katas from the WKF list; From the 4th round onwards they can repeat, as long as it is different from the previous one, alternately.

KUMITE

The kumite rules will be those of the FNK-P/WKF.

Infantile (U10): Combat time will be 1 minute without pauses, with a hantei decision.

Please note: The use of the Chest Protector and Shin Guards is not mandatory in the Infantile category (U10) nor in the Initiate category (U12).
